An Introduction to Patient and Public Involvement in Research

What do you need to know if you want to be part of meaningful Patient and Public Involvement in Research? This is an introductory workshop for practitioners, researchers, and members of the public who want to take part in making research more inclusive and meaningfully engaging. Participants will hear from academics and patient and public representatives and experts by experience about their stories of being involved in research, teaching and service user involvement.

Participants will have a chance to make new connections, find sources of information and learn how to involve and how to become involved.

This is a free event, funded by the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Collaborative Leadership in Applied Health Research and Care (CLAHRC) East of England. We will build on lessons from patient and public involvement in projects funded by NIHR CLAHRC EoE, since 2014, to explore and promote future further effective involvement.
